Super Gold Card Concessions Changes

Do you have a Super Gold Card and use it for concessions on Auckland Transport?

There are a few changes occurring that you'll want to know about.

While the scheme isn't changing the great free service offered to seniors, you'll now need to do a one off purchase of HOP card which works like an electronic ticket to get around.

The card will cost you \$10 and a \$5 minimum loading that can be used outside of the concession hours e.g. Monday— Friday before 9.00am.

Waitemata District Health Board Candidates

If you want excellent health services in Waitakere Hospital and West Auckland, you need to make sure you vote for candidates from West Auckland. There are always far more candidates from the North Shore than from West Auckland and they get on because the people of North Shore take the time and trouble to vote.

April Community Safety Forum.

The Waitakere Ranges Local Board held a Glen Eden community safety forum on April 20th in response from the community about security concerns.

The forum held at Ceramco Park had an estimated 30 residents attend with representatives from the local board, Auckland Council staff, Waitakere Police, Community Constable, Community Patrols, Pacific Wardens, Neighbourhood Support and the Glen Eden Business Association.

At the meeting I reviewed efforts of our local board to increase community safety and well-being by: **bringing** the Community Constable back into the village

mobilising all the security groups into a central office known as the Glen Eden Safety Hub

ensuring that Glen Eden and the Waitakere Ranges local board boundaries excluded the legal sale of synthetic cannabis a source of begging and disruptive behaviour in the past

as well as support for the Business Association and its members concerns for crime and safety in Glen Mall and West Coast Road.

Issues raised publically included concerns over increasing nuisance misconduct such as begging, rough sleeping, public drunkenness, roaming dogs and unsocial behaviour as well as more serious incidents of intimidation.

A particularly nasty assault repeated twice on an elderly woman provoked real concern about the failure of the police identifying and apprehending the offender.

The reduction of services and amenities was giving the town centre a particularly shabby and unsafe appearance was raised and that the local board would also be advocating for this to be addressed.

The Police wished to reassure the public that Glen Eden, generally speaking, was a safe place to live, work and shop, but with room for improvement.

With limits to a 24/7 police response to incidents, there was a clear message from the Deputy Mayor Penny Hulse that community safety and security also requires a cohesive and connected community who watch out for each other and work together for crime reduction.

Following the meeting, a community-led safety plan developed by all partners will be created, which will be made public when completed.

Over the next few weeks households will be getting the 'new' wheelie recycling bins.

Here are a few things you need to know about them...

1/. Don't use them until after July 1st.

2/. You can apply for a smaller 120lt or bigger 320lt bin, just go here; http://aucklandcouncil.custhelp.com/app/ask.

3/.The 1st day your new collection starts after 1st July is printed on a sticker on the bin (see photo below).

4/. The new service is fortnightly (not weekly).

5/. If you have a long driveway try the following options;

a). Keep your small blue bins to ferry recycling down to the larger bin at or near your gate.
b). If you have a tow hitch on your car get one of these; <u>http://www.sulo.co.nz/shop/binhitch/</u>
c). If you don't have a tow hitch there's this option; <u>http://eaglesrest.co.nz/products/bin-towa</u>

6/. You put all your recycling into one bin (it get sorted out at a plant) this includes paper and cardboard.

7/. Do read the material that comes with the bin!

8/. Don't use the bin until after 1st July!
